Unit 4	Knowledge			<p>Seasonal Change</p> <p>There are different types of weather in the UK.</p> <p>The weather in the United Kingdom can change from day to day.</p> <p>There are weather patterns are different in each season. Autumn: The weather is turns cooler, it can get windy and rainy. Look out for leaves changing colour. Winter: The weather can be wet, snowy and frosty. Look out for trees with no leaves. Spring: The weather is usually, sunny, rainy, dry and windy. Look for the leaves beginning to bud on the trees and flowers growing. Summer: The weather is usually dry and warm. However, you can still get rain.
