### School Nursing Service

You may not be aware that you can self-refer your child to the school nursing service. They can offer support and advice on topics such as relationships, eating, sleeping, behaviour and feeling sad or angry, which might be particularly helpful at the moment. If you have concerns about your child's emotional health and well-being – the School Nursing Service may be able to help. ### Online Safety

Keeping children Safe in Education brings to our attentions the 4 Cs: Content, Contact, Conduct, Commerce. For more information about the 4 Cs take a look at the [NSPCC website](#). Online safety at an Infant school is a lot about communication—one of our main messages for children is if they see anything online that makes them feel worried/sad/scared they need to tell a grown up. We reiterate they will not be in trouble, it is important that children tell us if they see content that makes them feel worried/sad/scared so we can offer an appropriate response: reassurance, comfort, explanation.
