Helping Hand

The helping hand is a tool we use to encourage children to talk about worries. Children are asked to think about five adults at school they can talk to if they feel worried, upset or sad about something. This is an activity we complete every September and is referred to throughout the school year. Can your child tell you their five adults?

Is your child like a steel trap when they get home? When you ask how their day was or what they have been learning are you met with

silence? These prompts might get them talking.

- Tell me the best bit about your day
- I saw on your timetable that you had PE/Science/phonics today, what can you tell me about it?
- Who or what made you smile today?
- Sharing something about your own day first might also encourage them to do the same



Whether we are welcoming you back to Goldfield or if this has been your child's first week at school, it has been so

exciting to see you. More specifically, it has been great to see your smiles and to hear what wour children have been enjoying about being



in their new classrooms. Classroom orientation has been high on our team's agenda alongside getting to know your child personally. We know that children who feel secure in their classroom and who feel seen and heard by the adults supporting them, will be most ready to learn. With this in mind, all staff from Nursery to Year 2 have thought carefully about their plans for the first couple of weeks and are prioritising learning which ensures children feel settled and are clear about where things are and how we look after them. In addition, there are lots of opportunities for talk and getting to know each other.


A HUGE thank you for all their fundraising which has enabled us to get air conditioning in Reception, Year 1 & Year 2. Next stop will be Nursery.



If your child is absent from school please contact the school office (via email or telephone) by 8.50am explaining the reason for their absence. Please note our school policy requires children to be kept at home for 48 hours after any episode of sickness or diarrhoea. This is to reduce the risk of passing on any bugs.



Emergency Contact Details

As per statutory requirements, we need to have details of at least two (and ideally three) people we can contact about your child in an emergency. Please could you check your Arbor App to make sure we have enough contact details for your child.

Pick-up Arrangements

We will only allow people who are on your child's contacts to collect your child at the end of the day. If your child is going home with someone not on their Arbor profile, please contact the school office or let the class teacher know.

We won't let your child go home with someone who isn't on their list unless you have let us know.



School Nursing Service

You may not be aware that you can self-refer your child to the school nursing service. They can offer support and advice on topics such as relationships, eating, sleeping, behaviour and feeling sad or angry, which might be particularly helpful at the moment. If you have concerns about your child's emotional health and well-being – the School Nursing Service may be able to help. Parents and carers can call the duty line number 0300 123 7572 for more information. Young people aged 11 – 19 can text the school nurse on 07480635050 or look for an on line referral form on www.hct.nhs.uk/ourservices/schoolnursing. Your child is entitled to a free lunch at school if they're in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2. If you <u>click here</u> our school could receive extra money to support your child—this is called Pupil Premium—if you receive certain benefits. Please <u>complete the form</u>.

For creative & art activities in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 please could you provide your child with an oversized t-shirt which isn't worn anymore that they could use.
