#### Practical Strategies to improve emotional regulation

When adults at home (and at school) create a structured environment which provides high levels of warmth with high boundaries, children are in the best possible place to learn to regulate their emotions. Avoiding the power-struggle whilst maintaining clear boundaries for behaviour can be difficult to manage. One suggested strategy is known as 'when-then'. When-then is a child-friendly way to remind children that they have something positive to look forward to. When your shoes are on, then we can go outside, When your LEGO is away, then you can choose your programme, When you're sitting in your seat, then you can have a snack, When you've brushed your teeth, then we can have a story.
